On Wednesday, March 24th Governor Andy Beshear signed Senate Bill 128 into law giving Kentucky's school districts the opportunity to offer a supplemental school year. This bill, also referred to as SB 128, would allow students currently enrolled in kindergarten through 12th grade to repeat, retake, or supplement courses or graded levels already completed. Students may participate in extracurricular activities if they meet KHSAA age and other eligibility requirements. Students may also be able to complete career technical certifications they were unable to complete during the 2020-21 school year.

Families have until April 30, 2021 to request the use of a supplemental year to the Raceland-Worthington Central Office.
